Global Studies Retreat FS 2021 Online meeting, May 21-22, 2021

Information and Program for Participants

The Global Studies Retreat offers an opportunity for PhD candidates to exchange ideas about their current work outside the ordinary university environment and among an interdisciplinary group of peers. Due to COVID-19 pandemic, the retreat will take place as an online event.



The group activities of the retreat comprise three parts:

A Given the current circumstances of Coronavirus outbreak and its subsequent impact, participants are required to read the introduction and three chapters (8, 9 & 10) of the book *Purity and Danger* by Mary Douglas. With the aim to reflect on concepts such as "contamination" and "otherness", we propose to exchange our thoughts about the global phenomenon of the current crisis and its different interpretations.

B. Each participant provides a short text of their own (0.5 to 10 pages) that she/he wants to discuss with colleagues. Participants are expected to read all of the texts provided by their peers in advance in order to discuss them during the retreat (40 min. for each text work). For this text work, participants are encouraged to speak their own language. The passive understanding of English, French, German, Spanish is welcome (simultaneous translations will be provided where necessary).

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C We finish with the experiment of "cocktail speech": each participant presents a cocktail receipt of her/his own in which the ingredients correspond to elements of their own research project in a coherent and funny way. For example: "My research consists on 2 cl fieldwork and 2 drops of participant observation shacked cold...". So, participants are encouraged to previously think about a cocktail with or without alcohol, of course, with the aim to paraphrase their research project.
