Visa = Entry to Switzerland

Residence permit = permit to live in Switzerland > apply and register after arrival to Switzerland

Residence Permit

Registration is mandatory



Everyone who lives or works in Switzerland must apply for a Swiss residence permit within the first 8-14 days after arrival.

One must register at the place of residence, e.g.

- Bern > registration Alien Police Bern
- Bolligen > registration cantonal authorities

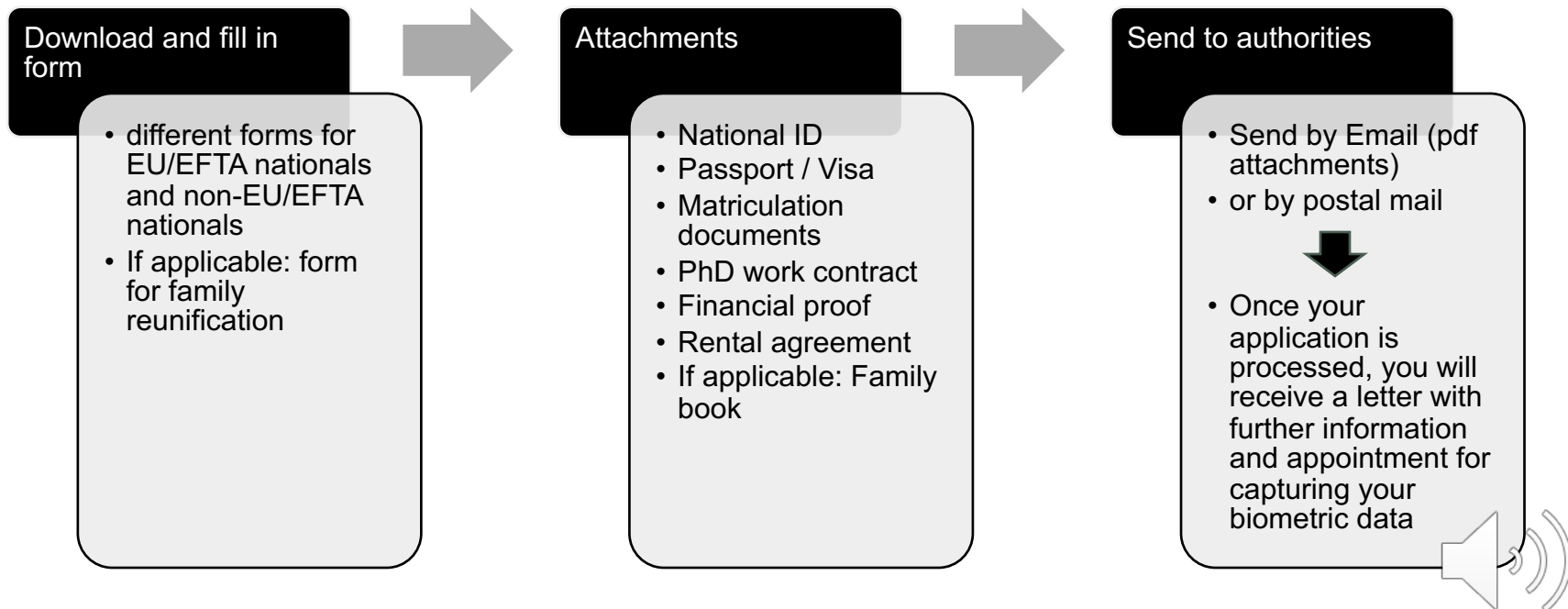

(registration for EU/EFTA nationals)

Anmeldung Drittstaatsangehörige – Zuzug Ausland (Registration for Third Country nationals)

Most of you have applied for a visa and hence have already submitted the necessary documents e.g. financial statement.

Attachments:

- Entry authorization («Ermächtigung zur Einreise»)
- Passport copy + visa
- matriculation (copy)
- Copy marriage certificate (when married/registered partnership)
- Rental contract – when in sublease a confirmation from the landlord or property management is required

- AHV-Nummer (Swiss social security number / old people's pension)

- PhD students may inquire with their employing institutes

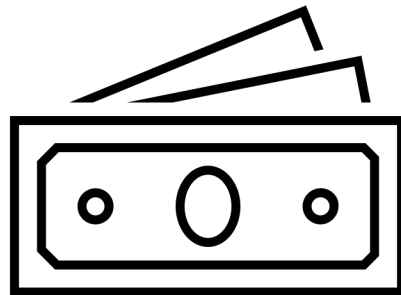
Residence permit Fees

EU / EFTA nationals:

approx. 96 CHF

Non- EU/EFTA nationals:

approx. 150-250 CHF



Initial Interview for Foreigners Integration

Local authorities will invite non-EU/EFTA nationals for an initial interview and discuss integration issues, e.g. learning German.

- Attendance is mandatory upon invitation
- mainly concerns PhDs and postdocs with families

Information Sheet for Newly Arriving Residents who are Third Country Nationals

**You have recently moved to the Canton of Bern.
You are very welcome!**



At the initial interview your new local authority will welcome you and give you important information that will help you to settle in.

In accordance with the Integrationsgesetz (Integration Act) of the Canton of Bern, starting in 2015, local authorities meet with foreign nationals who are moving into the Canton of Bern for an initial interview. At this meeting, you will receive information on life in the municipality and on integration offerings (language courses, meeting centre, associations, etc.).

You will obtain informative materials and learn about your rights and obligations.



If you need more information, the local authority will register you at a contact office for integration matters.

Based on the various criteria identified in the Integration Act of the Canton of Bern (art. 5, section 4, IntG), the local authority will decide whether to send you to a contact office for integration matters for a more in-depth interview.

The contact offices for integration matters are advising services that assist foreign nationals with integration matters.



The contact office for integration matters will contact you and schedule an appointment for a free advising session with you.

If the local authority has referred you to a contact office for integration matters, that office will give you an appointment within five weeks of the initial interview. There, you will be met by a trained advisor who speaks your native language or another language in which you can communicate well.

The advisor can provide assistance in many ways, e.g. in finding a suitable language course, explaining how to go about having your diploma recognized or arranging a support programme for your children.



Processing of your application for a residency permit will not recommence until you have been at the contact office for integration matters.

Once you have visited the contact office for integration matters, the migration authority will continue processing your residency permit application.

Your permit can be issued as soon as the application has been approved and your biometric data have been registered at a document centre. The local authority will contact you to invite you to come pick up your permit.
